

2021 Warner Camp Breathe Retreat COVID-19 Procedures & Waiver

Procedures that Warner Memorial Camp is taking, working in conjunction with the Allegan County Health Department to minimize the risk of COVID-19 transmission include. Please note that the protocols may change at any time:

Registration

1. All campers and adult leaders will have temperatures taken at drop off.
2. All guests will have read and signed this packet and submitted to camp.
3. All registration staff will be wearing masks, gloves during sign in, and check out.
4. Participants are to wear masks while checking in. Please wear a mask, be socially distant, stay with your group (POD), and the guidelines set by your church/group. Wash hands regularly, and respect others desire to be safe.

Indoors

1. Campers will remain with their group.
2. Thank you for wearing your mask indoors.
3. Campers & leaders will social distance (six feet when possible).

Food Service

1. Food Service Staff and Servers will wear gloves and masks at all times while serving.
2. Campers will eat in their group in ventilated dining space. Groups are welcome to eat outside!
3. Food and drinks served cafeteria style/pre-plated.

Cleaning

1. Bathrooms cleaned regularly.
2. Meeting spaces cleaned regularly.
3. Staff will wear gloves at all times while cleaning.

Program (Activity) Areas

1. Program area equipment and surrounding surfaces wiped down in between usage.
2. Storage sheds (hatchet toss, archery tag, etc.) cleaned once a day (minimum).
3. Cleaning stations will be set up at specific program areas and around the property.

Staff

1. Warner Camp staff will have their temperatures taken once a day.
2. Group leaders will remain with their group and practice social distancing.
3. Program, fulltime, and support staff will have limited contact with campers while onsite/program areas.
4. Warner staff are regularly updated on COVID-19.

Campers

1. Campers will remain with their group and have limited interaction with other groups.
2. Campers will be instructed and supervised (to practice social distancing and not share items).
3. If a camper becomes sick while at camp they will be isolated from other campers (and supervised) until a parent/guardian is able to come and pick them up.
